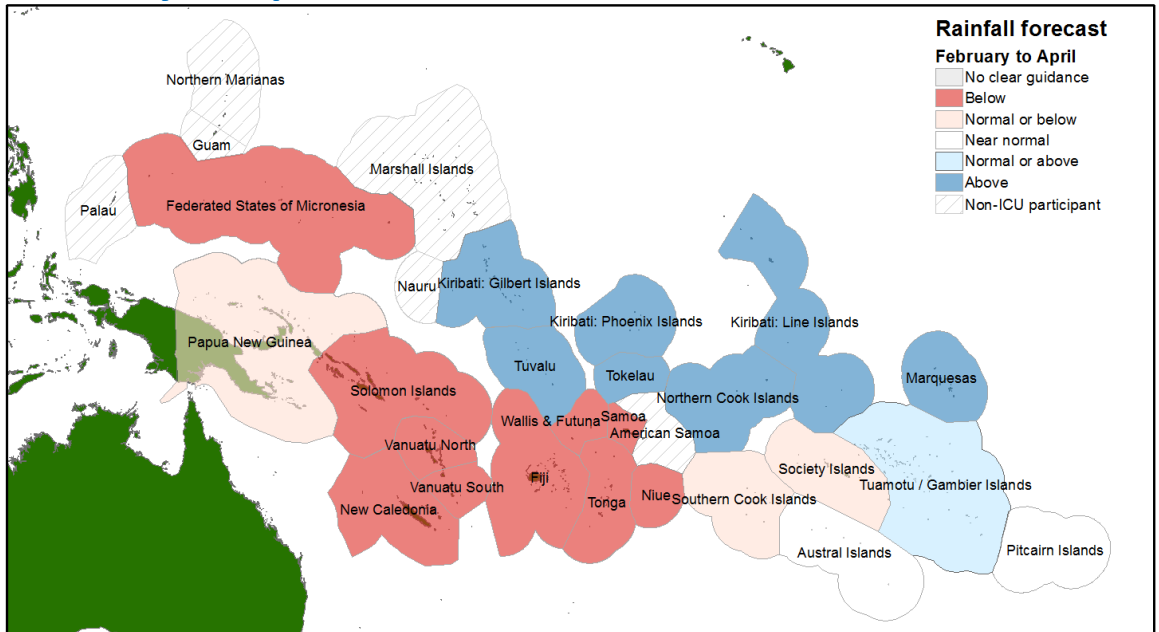

## February to April 2016 rainfall forecast



## Regional drought potential advisory

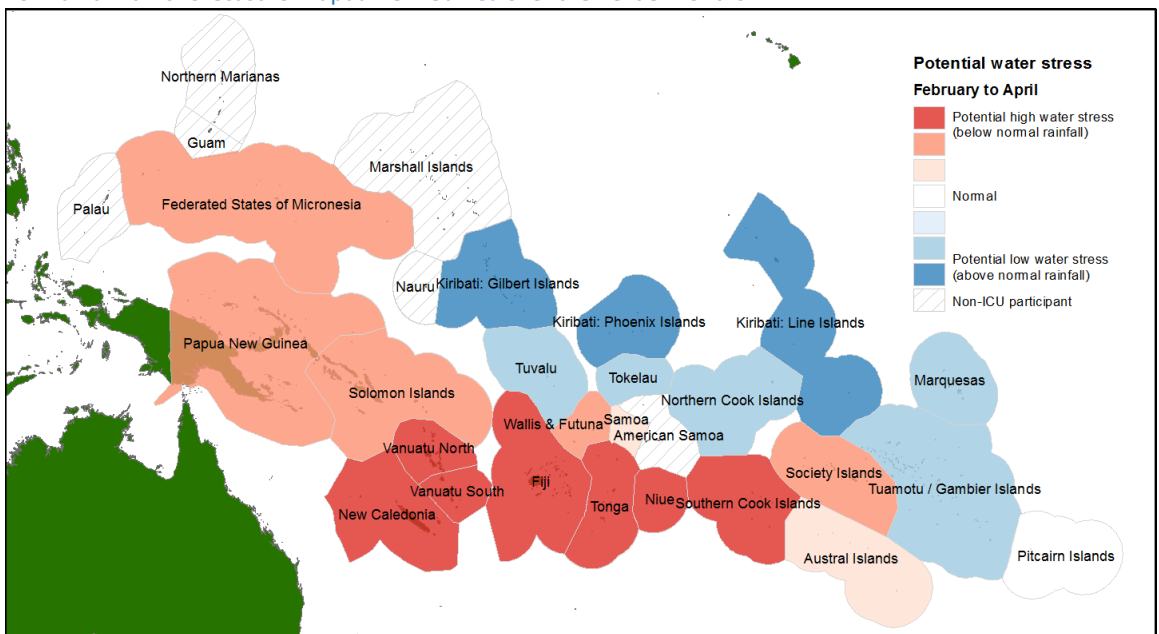
Based on rainfall anomaly classification over the past six months and forecast rainfall anomaly classification over the next 3 months

**New Caledonia, Vanuatu:** Below to well below normal rainfall experienced over 5 of the past 6 months. Below normal rainfall is forecast over the next 3 months.

**Fiji, Tonga, Southern Cook Islands:** Below to well below normal rainfall experienced over 4 of the past 6 months. Below normal rainfall is forecast over the next 3 months for Fiji and Tonga while normal or below normal rainfall over the next 3 month is forecast for the Southern Cook Islands.

**Niue, Federated States of Micronesia, Wallis & Futuna:** Below to well below normal rainfall experienced over 3 of the past 6 months. Below normal rainfall is forecast over the next 3 months.

**Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands:** Below to well below normal rainfall experienced over 4 of the past 6 months. Below normal rainfall is forecast over the next 3 months for the Solomon Islands while normal or below normal rainfall is forecast for Papua New Guinea over the next 3 months.
